Psalm 78:1-2

“O my people, hear my teaching;

listen to the words of my mouth.

I will open my mouth in parables,

I will utter hidden things, things from of old--”

Memory work due September 15 :

Psalm 78:3-4

“what we have heard and known,

what our fathers have told us.

We will not hide them from their children;

we will tell the next generation

the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord,

His power and the wonders He has done.”

Memory work due October 4:

Hebrews 11:1

“Now faith is being sure of what we hope for

and certain of what we do not see.”

Memory work due October 25:

Psalm 8:1-2

“O Lord, our Lord,

how majestic is your name in all the earth!

You have set your glory

above the heavens.

From the lips of children and infants

you have ordained praise

because of your enemies,

to silence the foe and the avenger.”

Memory work due November 1:

Psalm 8:3-5

“When I consider your heavens,

the work of your fingers,

the moon and the stars,

which you have set in place,

what is man that you are mindful of him,

the son of man that you care for him?

You made him a little lower than the heavenly beings

and crowned him with glory and honor.”

Memory work due November 8:

Psalm 8:6-9

“You made him ruler over the works of your hands;

you put everything under his feet:

all flocks and herds,

and the beasts of the field,

the birds of the air,

and the fish of the sea,

all that swim the paths of the seas.

O Lord, our Lord,

how majestic is your name in all the earth!”

Memory work due November 22:

Proverbs 1:7

“The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge,

But fools despise wisdom and discipline.”

Memory work due January 12:

Amos 5:14, 24

“Seek good, not evil,
that you may live.

Then the Lord God Almighty will be with you,

Just as you say He is. . . .

But let justice roll on like a river,
righteousness like a never-failing stream!”

Memory work due December 8:

Isaiah 53:1-3

“Who has believed our message
And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?
He grew up before him like a tender shoot,
and like a root out of dry ground.
He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him,
nothing in his appearance that we should desire him.
He was despised and rejected by men,
a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering.
Like one from whom men hide their faces
he was despised, and we esteemed him not.”

Memory work due December 14:

Isaiah 53:4-5

“Surely he took up our infirmities
and carried our sorrows,
yet we considered him stricken by God,
smitten by him, and afflicted.

But he was pierced for our transgressions,
he was crushed for our iniquities;
the punishment that brought us peace was upon him,
and by his wounds we are healed.”

Memory work due December 20:

Isaiah 53:6-7

“We all, like sheep, have gone astray,
each of us has turned to his own way;
and the Lord has laid on him
the iniquity of us all.

He was oppressed and afflicted,
yet he did not open his mouth.

He was led like a lamb to the slaughter,
and as a sheep before her shearers is silent,
so he did not open his mouth.”

Memory work due January 20:

John 1:1

“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.”

Memory work due January 27:

John 1:14

“The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.”

Memory work due February 10:

Jesus Called the Twelve Disciples (song)

Jesus called the twelve disciples: Peter and Andrew, James and John.
He called Philip and Bartholomew, six so far, we're half-way done!
Thomas, Matthew, James and Thaddaeus, Simon, Judas; finally,
we have twelve. But our king Jesus also is calling you and me.

Memory work due February 23:

Matthew 5:1-5

“Now when He saw the crowds, He went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to Him, and He began to teach them, saying:

Blessed are the poor in spirit,
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn,
for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek,
for they will inherit the earth.”

Memory work due March 6:

Matthew 5:6-9

“Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness,
for they will be filled.

Blessed are the merciful,
for they will be shown mercy.

Blessed are the pure in heart,
for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers,
for they will be called sons of God.”

Memory work due March 20:

Matthew 5:10-12

“Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness,
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely
say all kinds of evil against you because of Me. Rejoice and be
glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way
they persecuted the prophets who were before you.”
